

20 Fall Speech & Language Activities for Toddlers

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- Make smores – targets following directions, sequencing, and vocabulary
- Jump in leaves – this is a sensory activity and teaches action words
- Look for acorns – builds language skills and vocabulary
- Make hot chocolate – works on ability to follow directions and sequencing
- Eat an apple - wakes up the mouth for speech
- Go to a pumpkin patch – increases speech, language, and vocabulary skills
- Share what you're thankful for - develops conversation and turn taking
- Eat candy corn – this is a yummy treat for your mouth and strengthens muscles in the mouth
- Look for different kinds of leaves – works on concepts and describing skills
- Read a book about fall – improves overall speech and language
- Go on a fall nature walk - enjoy the cool air while working on vocabulary and conversation
- Free play – this is just fun and increases speech and language skills
- Complete a fall art activity – develops fine motor and how to follow directions
- Paint a tree – a fun sensory activity that targets lots of speech and language
- Play dress up in Halloween costumes – develops pretend play and language
- Play outside – improves fine and gross motor, social skills, and language skills
- Talk about the fall season – teaches about the seasons and improves conversational turn taking.
- Carve a pumpkin - demonstrates following directions and targets the senses, and
- Teach your child about Thanksgiving - this is great for vocabulary, speech sounds, and conversation
- Pop popcorn – a fun activity for toddlers to work on following directions
